### National inclusive education month - February 1st-February 28th, 2019 **National Recognition Certificate**

The Canadian Association for Community Living will be awarding a group or individual from each province with the National Recognition Certificate. In New Brunswick, there will be a minimum of one Francophone certificate and a minimum of one Anglophone certificate awarded. Judging will be done by the Inclusive Education Committee of the New Brunswick Association for Community Living from nominations received by February 1st, 2019, 5:00 pm.

#### Criteria and conditions of participation:

- An individual or team of people deemed worthy of the award for making a positive contribution to inclusive education in their province/territory. (ie. teacher(s), student(s), principal(s), other school staff, school committee, post-secondary institution, early childhood centre or an individual from your community who has made a contribution to inclusive education) Visit www.nbacl.nb.ca for past winners.
- Nominees will be asked to participate in an interview (this may include a visit to the site to meet the nominee in their educational environment).
- The recipient(s) will be presented with the National Recognition Certificate at a ceremony (location and time to be announced).
- Special guests and media will be invited to attend.
- Media may ask the recipients to be available for photographs and interviews.
- Provide two references in addition to this nomination form. References can provide a written reference letter or provide their contact information for a phone interview. Phone interviews will be conducted by a member of the Inclusive Education Committee of the NBACL.
- Fill-out the **Required information** page
